

Minutes of the Meeting of the South Richland Conservancy District

May 12, 2016

Fulton County Public Library
320 W. 7th Street, Rochester

In attendance were: Joe Hunting, Chairman; Doug Garvison, Vice-Chairman; Jamie Schiff (by phone), Treasurer/Financial Clerk.

The minutes from the District's February 18 Annual Meeting were approved.

Rich Martin provided a report on the water line's operation. The coliform sampling protocol has changed. It allows in case of failure to test at another collection site prior to having to issue a boil order. The District tests for coliform once a month, whereas the City of Rochester is required to sample five times a month due to its different status. The Department of Environmental Management sanitary inspection took place. The inspector asked for a copy of the sampling plan. The District also samples for lead and copper and chlorine.

The generator at the pump station was serviced and a new battery has been installed. A new bypass and check valve were installed. Hydrants were flushed in April with no discoloration in water. The daily pumping rate average for February through April was approximately 5400 gallons/day.

The annual Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) will be issued shortly. The District's report includes the CCR issued by the City.

Paul Stork from AMEC Foster Wheeler handed out several documents pertaining to the groundwater remediation project. The second performance monitoring event of the 43 performance wells, to gauge remediation efforts, was recently completed. The documents included a map depicting the treatment zones, arrays and well locations along with graphs of select performance monitoring wells located in the treatment zones.

Generally, there have been some nice decreases in contaminant concentrations. There is good distribution of the bio-amendment, and bacteria populations are positive. Some wells have been increasing in concentrations, which is to be expected in the short run due to contaminant desorption from soil as a result of the injections.

The next performance monitoring event is scheduled for June. A bio-amendment injection is anticipated towards the end of the third quarter. Later in the year, annual monitoring of groundwater site wide (91 wells) will take place.

Between the plant and the retention pond in back contaminants are being treated with zero valent iron (ZVI), which is a chemical treatment, rather than a biological treatment as in other areas. This stronger treatment is due to high concentrations there and groundwater in that area will flow towards, and be treated by, the ZVI.

The District's annual report was filed with the Fulton County Superior Court on March 4. The Amendment to the Letter of Credit that secures Textron's financial obligations, which increased that amount to \$2,060,000, was received by the District

The next Board meeting will be held on Thursday, September 8, commencing at 5:30 p.m. at the Fulton County Rochester library branch.

The meeting was thereupon adjourned.
