

Minutes of the South Richland Conservancy District's Board Meeting

August 22, 2019

Fulton County Public Library
320 W. 7th Street, Rochester

In attendance were: Joe Hunting, Chairman; Doug Garvison, Vice-Chairman; Jamie Schiff, Treasurer/Financial Clerk (by phone).

The minutes from the Board's meeting in May were approved.

Rich Martin provided a report on the water line's operation. Daily average water use for May was 4,430 gal., for June 4,507 gal. and for July 6,158 gal. The generator was serviced and a new battery installed. Disinfectant by-product and lead and copper samples were taken. GAI advised that the circuit board would be shipped Monday and when they receive it they will schedule a time to replace it to correct our false suction pressure readings. The new circuit board for our Omni Site alarm system was successfully installed.

Paul Stork from Wood, LLC gave an update on the groundwater remediation project. He discussed the transition of the Performance groundwater monitoring (GWM) into the Stability groundwater monitoring phase. After 10 performance GWM events were implemented to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedial injections, the Stability GWM phase began in February 2019. The scope of the first Stability GWM event performed in February 2019 included collecting GW samples from 30 MWs which comprised both quarterly wells and semi-annual wells. The May 2019 Stability GWM event included collecting samples from just the quarterly (12) set of wells. Paul handed out time-series graphs for the 12 quarterly monitoring wells and a map showing the locations of the stability wells.

Paul discussed in general the time-series graphs and how the results looked steady and favorable. The only location that was showing any signification concentration of VOCs was MW-17. He explained that, while MW-17 still is showing VOCs, when compared to pre-remediation concentrations it has been reduced approximately 75%.

Paul advised that the third quarter Stability GWM event was started in August and included both the semi-annual and quarterly wells (30 locations). Also in August, Wood is implementing the Annual GWM event, which consists of 91 MWs that span the area from 450N down to the Tippecanoe River. The last correspondence received from IDEM on the project was April 2018.

Indiana DOT has advised that next spring they will be replacing the bridge over the Tippecanoe River.

The next Board meeting will take place Thursday, November 14 and will commence at 5:30 p.m. It will take place at the Fulton County Rochester library branch, space permitting.

The meeting was thereupon adjourned.
